

The improvement of energy generation and efficiency reflects positive economic and social outcomes. Our projects range from providing oil derivatives to power plants to establishing power stations across Yemen.

The Saudi Oil Derivatives Grant to Yemen has made it possible for 80 power stations to fully and continuously operate, generating, in return, constant and stable energy that is powering homes, hospitals, and schools.

Our initiatives and programs include supplying Yemeni governorates with power generators and establishing new power stations to improve energy generation and distribution.

Stories from Yemen

Abundant Production

Residents of Hajjah governorate suffer from a serious agricultural production problem in which the crops are grown either rotten or poisonous, which affected farmers income negatively. %70 of Yemeni people rely on agriculture as a source of income. To end this dilemma, SDRPY provided air-conditioned greenhouses to those farmers. "Thanks to SDRPY, I start my day by irrigating crops that I successfully planted in the greenhouses that include techniques to protect my crops. Now we eat vegetables, and are able to supply markets and low-income villagers" Ahmed said (a farmer from Hajjah). He expressed his appreciation by saying "such agricultural projects build capacities and increase awareness." Thus, Ahmed now spends his days happily irrigating and harvesting his vegetables.



Stories from Yemen

Abdulrahman is recovering well

Abdulrahman, an elementary school student, suffered kidney failure due to medical neglect. His deteriorating health affected his way of living, including his school performance. While he recovered well after treatment, his health deteriorated again in 2018 due to a lack of medical guidance. With toxins accumulating in his body and specialized treatment equipment no longer operating in Aden. Abdulrahman soon went into a coma. Shortly, SDRPY launched a program equipping the dialysis center at Al-Jumhuriah Hospital in Aden. With the presence of the new equipment, Abdulrahman's health has improved. We at the SDPRY wish Abdulrahman a speedy recovery and anticipate his return to school very soon.

Small Projects with Large Impacts

To live 12 years without attending school is abnormal, but it was a situation a Yemeni girl found herself in. She was raised in a remote village where the nearest school is 10 km away. Due to the distance and unsafe roads when going to school, her parents decided not to let her go to school for her own safety. Finally, a school bus provided by SDRPY passed by her village, that is when her parents got excited to see a safe transportation that will give their daughter a chance to attend school for the first time in 12 years, which resulted in encouraging the residents to let their children attend school and have equal access to education.
